SUMMARY

The Director of Communications will define and implement a comprehensive communications strategy for the National Housing Law Project (NHLP). The Director will help draft communications plans for policy campaigns, shape all organizational communications and cultivate relationships with journalists and other members of the media. Responsibilities include management of a Development & Communications Associate and working collaboratively with program and operations staff. The Director of Communications will serve as an in-house expert and mentor to other staff regarding best practices, messaging, and use of media to achieve NHLP's desired outcomes. They will also take a lead role in crafting appeals to donors. The ideal candidate will bring strong communication, marketing, and interpersonal skills, excellent project management, and a strategic approach to fundraising campaigns and external communications. They will partner with staff to shape and share the story of NHLP's fight for a just housing system. The Director of Communications reports to the Chief Operating Officer.

The National Housing Law Project is a national legal and advocacy organization and serves as a support center to legal aid attorneys, organizers, and other advocates. NHLP's mission is to advance housing justice for poor people and communities. We achieve this by strengthening and enforcing the rights of tenants, increasing housing opportunities for underserved communities, and preserving and expanding the nation's supply of safe and affordable homes. NHLP works at the crossroads of housing and community development advocacy, legal services for the poor, and civil rights.
